





# from the Mayor's Desk —

RON RUSSELL  
ON WANGANUI

## — THE SWIMMING COMPLEX —

"Wanganui as a City is very favourably placed in regard to the sporting and cultural amenities that it has. It is largely on account of the initiatives that have been taken by City groups and community groups over the years that we have abundant sports grounds, attractive and useful cultural facilities, a magnificent sports stadium, a Memorial Hall, and so on. For many years now it has been considered that the one weakness in this has been the lack of a swimming complex, and my mind goes back to the time when a group of service clubs busied themselves promoting a project that would, perhaps, meet all the wishes of a community swimming complex.

This was a large scale proposal which involved a 50 metre pool, a 25 metre pool and a diving pool. Today's costs would mean that the construction of such a complex, in one bite anyway, would exceed the resources of our community.

What is currently being looked at is a start to a project that could be a continuing and on-going one, which would ultimately provide a worthwhile complex and probably be sited at Springvale Park. The start that is envisaged would revolve round the construction of a 25 metre heated, indoor pool. Now the debate that surrounds this of course is:

1. Where is the money to come from?  
Obviously a large proportion of it has to come from the Community, although such a project would be able to avail itself of Government and other subsidies. Already the Council has set aside in excess of \$40,000 being the money saved annually by the closure of the Central Baths and now earmarked for future investment in the new complex.
2. The other factor is that people might regard a 25 metre covered pool as catering only for those who are interested in competitive swimming. We are currently considering concepts that might meet the Community's broader wishes and yet, at the same time, provide the sort of facility that would enable our young and promising swimmers to train properly for competitive events.

The whole question is being investigated. More, undoubtedly, will be heard of it as we are looking towards conceptual plans that are going to give us some idea of what such a project could look like and what its likely cost is. When these factors are known, the issue will have to go to the Community for endorsement or otherwise.

I believe that it is a project that is worthy of public support, (and CERTAINLY public consideration) until a point is reached where we know where we are going."

*In 3-6 months a specific proposal should be available for public scrutiny. OUTLOOK takes the view that given the considerable opposition to intensive industrial development in Wanganui we could do well to examine the economic benefits to be gained from the creation of civic assets in the form of cultural and sporting facilities that will draw many and regular sportspeople and visitors to near centrally placed Wanganui and with them a constant influx of money to not only contribute to the creation of those assets but also to the prosperity of Wanganui.*





# THE APRIL GARDEN

Dear Gardener,

Here are a few ideas for your APRIL GARDENING PROGRAMME –

## THE VEGETABLE GARDEN ..

Most winter vegetable plants should be in and well under way by now. However, it is not TOO late, so buy your plants and get into that vegetable patch smartly. We would suggest the following:

**WINTER and SPRING CABBAGE – 'RUAPEHU' CAULIFLOWER  
SILVERBEET – LETTUCE – SPROUTING BROCCOLI**

Seed for sowing now ...

**'CALIFORNIAN RED' ONIONS – PARSLEY – RADISH – SPINACH  
BROAD BEANS**

**DON'T FORGET** to dig those Kumaras – be careful not to cut or bruise and store in boxes or cartons in a dry place.

## THE FLOWER GARDEN ...

Plant Now – CALENDULA, CINERERIA, CORNFLOWER, DIANTHUS, LOBELIA, LIVINGSTONE DAISY, NEMESIA, PANSY, POPPY, VOILA, POPPY SNAPDRAGON, STOCK, SWEET PEA, SWEET WILLIAM, WALLFLOWER, CARNATION, RANUNCULI, ANENOME, TULIP and FREEZIA BULBS.

## HEDGE and SHELTER ...

Nothing adds more to the general appearance of your home than neat well-chosen hedges. They provide shelter, seclusion, beauty and charm.
















