Two recent visitors to the Museum Mr H.H. Barrett pictured below left and Mr Taiaroa Maloney recounted a story of a pole carved many years ago at Taumarunui. Te Kooti was seeking asylum there from Rewi Maniapoto and carved the pole to represent him, naming it Manga, the name by which he was known. The pole was to demonstrate the mana of the land and it was placed in the ground and fired upon. On his own ground Manga's mana was strong and warded the bullets off. Maniapoto then renamed the pole Te Kooti and again the men fired but this time the pole was struck and this indicated to the people that Te Kooti's fighting was finished there and thus the pole came to symbolise the horonga pai.

A magnificent story of men and power and of a time and people well integrated into the forces of the natural world about them. Indeed it would be interesting if, today, our leaders assumed their positions solely from their innate personal qualities and mana rather than from money, dealing and political machination. It would also be interesting to see us head toward the 21st century basing our future development decisions on pragmatic ecological viability rather than the vague idealism of business theory that attempts to validate injurious industries by the virtues of balance sheet and profit. However the best of all possible worlds we could debate till the cows come home.









ABOVE : The oldest exhibit was the first locomotive built by NZR in Addington in 1889. A W class loco, it provided a novel playground for visiting children.







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









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














